## Addendum 1 to City of Alice Disaster Declaration Stay Home Stay Safe

Amended/Revised Declaration, Order & Directive Issued: March 26, 2020

Consistent with the Texas Governor's Executive Order GA-14 dated March 31, 2020 and the Mayor's Emergency Order, this Addendum to the Stay Home Stay Safe Measures sets out additional measures by Emergency Management Director, Mayor Jolene B. Vanover of the City of Alice.

- a. Enforcement. In addition to enforcement through citation and fine, the City will exercise its authority to further enforce compliance with the Mayor's Declaration for repeat violations by businesses by pulling the Certificate of Occupancy for those violation businesses.
- b. Essential Retail. Food service providers, including grocery stores, warehouse stores, big-box stores, bodegas, liquor stores, gas stations and convenience stores, farmers' markets that sell food products and household staples.
  - a. Limit the amount of people in an establishment to two (2) per family unit.
  - b. Implement an organized line system where people are spaced at least six (6) feet apart; and
  - c. Post in a highly visible location, the establishment's guidelines that meet (a) and (b) above.
- c. Community Parks and Property. All recreational areas where social distancing and sanitizing requirements are difficult or impossible to meet, including community and school playgrounds, outdoor exercise equipment, basketball courts including those located in apartment complexes or HOA areas, shall close for the duration of the declaration.
- d. Municipal Parks and Property. Certain facilities within the municipal parks should be closed to further reduce the spread of COVID-19. Use of our parks must continue to be consistent with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding social distancing.
  - 1) Beginning at 11:59 PM on Wednesday, April 8, 2020, park basketball courts, outdoor exercise equipment and playgrounds will be closed to the public. These closures will remain in effect until the earlier of the following: the Mayor's Disaster Declaration Stay Home Stay Safe determines that the closures are no longer necessary; or, the Governor's Executive Order GA-14 are rescinded, or expire.

2) Beginning at 11:59 PM on Wednesday, April 8, 2020 all persons must vacate City parks and all City parks will close until further notice. The park trails will remain open for walking and running, as long as, users consistently follow social distancing.
