EXECUTIVE ORDER NW-07 OF COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF ISSUED April 29, 2020

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108, Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff declared a state of local disaster on March 13, 2020 due to imminent threat arising from COVID-19;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), on March 18, 2020, the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved an Order Continuing Declaration of State of Local Disaster for Bexar County (hereafter, the "Order of Continuation of Declaration");

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), the consent by Commissioners Court authorizes the Bexar County Judge to continue to exercise the powers agranted by the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 for the period specified in the Order of Continuingaa Declaration;aa

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued a declaration of public health disaster in and for the State of Texas and on March 19, 2020, the Texas Department of State Health Services issued a declaration of a public health disaster in the State of Texas for the first time since 1901;

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020 the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved the Order of Continuation of Declaration and authorized the Bexar County Judge to take such actions as are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Bexar County by the issuance of executive order ("Executive Order");

WHERAS, the County Judge has determined that extraordinary emergency measures must be taken to mitigate the effects of this public health emergency and to facilitate a response to the public health threat;

WHEREAS, a County Judge is authorized to control ingress to and egress from a disaster area and control the movement of persons and occupancy of premises on an appropriate local scale in accordance with Section 418.108(g) of the Texas Government Code and his authority as Emergency Management Director; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Executive Order to remain as consistent with and to harmonize, to the extent possible, the executive orders of Governor Greg Abbott and the mandates contained in the current declaration of the Mayor of the City of San Antonio (as extended or modified);

WHEREAS, by the authority vested in me as Bexar County Judge and as the Emergency Management Director for the County of Bexar to continue to protect the health and safety of the community and address developing and rapidly changing circumstances when presented by the current public health emergency, I hereby rescind my previous Executive Orders and any Supplemental Executive Orders and issue this revised Executive Order in their place.

PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS DISASTER ACT OF 1975, BEXAR COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF HEREBY ISSUES THIS EXECUTIVE ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Effective as of 11:59 p.m. on Wednesday, April 29, 2020, and continuing through 12:01 a.m. on May 19, 2020, unless extended, modified or terminated early by Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff or as otherwise indicated below:

I.oo Stay Home Work Safe Measures. Subject to the definitions and further guidance setoo out in Subsections (i)-(ii) below, that all persons currently residing within theoo incorporated and unincorporated territory of Bexar County are hereafter directed to stayoo at home ("Stay Home Work Safe Measures"). If individuals are using shared or outdooroo spaces outside their home or engaged in Essential Services or Reopened Services (asoo those terms are defined below), then they must maintain social distancing of at least sixoo feet from any other person. All persons may leave their residences only to engage inoo Outdoor Activity (as defined in Section V of this Executive Order) or to provide or obtainoo Essential/Reopened Services.oo

All public or private gatherings occurring outside a single household or single-family living unit are prohibited unless specifically exempted under this Executive Order. Members of a household or single-family living unit may gather.

All businesses operating within Bexar County except Essential Services and Reopened Services, as defined by executive order GA-18 issued by Governor Greg Abbott are required to stop operations and close. All businesses operating within Bexar County that are required to remain closed should review and follow the COVID-19 Health Transition Team Report: A guide to reopening San Antonio and Bexar County.

i)00 Face Coverings. All people 10 years or older must wear a cloth face covering overoo their nose and mouth when in a public place or when patronizing an Essentialoo Service or Reopened Service where it is difficult to keep six feet away from otheroo people such as visiting a grocery store/pharmacy or working in areas that involveoo close proximity with other coworkers. The CDC advises face coverings for peopleoo 2 years or older. Coverings may include homemade masks, scarfs, bandanas, or aoo handkerchief. Residents must continue to maintain social distancing of at least sixoo feet while outside their residence.oo

Employers that qualify as Essential Services or Reopened Services (which shall include all offices and departments of Bexar County) must provide face coverings to employees who are in an area or performing an activity which will necessarily involve close contact or proximity to co-workers or the public where six feet of separation from other individuals is not feasible.

IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT YOU NOT OBTAIN OR WEAR MEDICAL MASKS or N-95 RESPIRATORS AS THEY ARE A NEEDED RESOURCE FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS. Our healthcare workers and first responders on the front-line combating COVID-19 must have priority access to medical masks or other personal protective equipment.

Face coverings do not need to be worn in the following circumstances:

- •odWhen exercising outside or engaging in physical activity outsideoo
- •o While driving alone or with passengers who are part of the same householdoo as the driveroo
- •ooWhen doing so poses a greater mental or physical health, safety, or securityoo riskoo
- •odWhile pumping gas or operating outdoor equipmentoo
- •o While in a building or activity that requires security surveillance or screening, oo for example, banksoo
- •ooWhen consuming food or drinkoo

Please note that face coverings are a secondary strategy to other mitigation efforts. Face coverings are *not* a replacement for social distancing, frequent handwashing, and self-isolation when sick. All people should follow CDC recommendations for how to wear and take off a mask.

Residents must keep up the following habits while in public:

- oowashing hands before you leave home and when you return,oo
- •oostaying at least six feet away from others,oo
- •ocavoiding touching nose or face,oo
- •omot using disposable masks more than three times, andoo
- •oowashing reusable cloth masks regularly to prevent the spread of the virus.oo

Consistent with Executive Order GA-18 issued by Governor Greg Abbott, a civil or criminal penalty will not be imposed on individuals for failure to wear a face covering.

ii) Definitions of Essential Services and Reopened Services:

- (a) <u>Essential Services</u>. For purposes of this Executive Order, Essential Services are ss defined as follows:
 - 1)sEverything listed by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) inss its Guidance on the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce, Version 3.0ss or any subsequent version, plus religious services conducted in churches, ss congregations, and houses of worship. Other Essential Services may bess added to this list with the approval of the Texas Division of Emergencyss Management (TDEM). TDEM shall maintain an online list of Essentialss Services. Requests for additions should be directed to TDEM atss EssentialServices@tdem.texas.gov or by visiting the TDEM website at:ss www.tdem.texas.gov/essentialservicesss
- (b)s<u>Reopened Services.</u> For purposes of this Executive Order, Reopened Servicesss consist of the following to the extent they are not already an Essential Service:ss
 - 1)ssRetail services that may be provided through pickup, delivery by mail, orss delivery to the customer's doorstep.ss
 - 2)ssIn-store retail services, for retail establishments that operate at up to 25ss percent of the total listed occupancy of the retail establishment.ss
 - 3)ssDine-in restaurant services, for restaurants that operate at up to 25 percentss of the total listed occupancy of the restaurant; provided, however, that:ss
 - a)s this applies only to restaurants that have less than 51 percent of theirss gross receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages and are thereforess not required to post the 51 percent sign required by Texas law asss determined by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, andss
 - b)ssvalet services are prohibited except for vehicles with placards or platesss for disabled parking.ss
 - c)ssthe use of drive-thru, pickup, or delivery options for food and drinks isss highly encouraged.ss
 - 4)ssMovie theaters that operate at up to 25 percent of the total listed occupancyss of any individual theater for any screening.ss
 - 5)ssShopping malls that operate at up to 25 percent of the total listed occupancyss of the shopping mall; provided, however, that within shopping malls, thess food court dining areas, play areas, and interactive displays and settingsss must remain closed.ss
 - 6)ssOnce authorized by specific approval of the County Judge, Bexar Countyss museums and Bexar County libraries may operate at up to 25 percent of thess

total listed occupancy with the exception of any components that have interactive functions or exhibits, including child play areas, which must remain closed.

7)o Services provided by an individual working alone in an office.oo

8)oGolf course operations.oo

9)o Such additional services as may be enumerated by future executive ordersoo or proclamations by Texas Governor Greg Abbott.oo

Reopened Services are required to follow the specific sector guidance in the Governor's Report to Reopen Texas and shall conspicuously post the applicable maximum occupancy required under the Governor's Order.

- II. <u>Health Protocols for Essential or Reopened Services.</u> That in providing or obtaining Essential Services or Reopened Services, people and businesses should follow the minimum standard health protocols recommended by the Texas Department of State Health Services and should implement social distancing, work from home if possible, and practice good hygiene, environmental cleanliness, and sanitation.
 - a)oEssential services shall limit the amount of people at pickup or in an establishmentoo so that social distancing may be maintained. oo
 - b) Essential services shall implement an organized line system where people areoo spaced at least 6 feet apart, oo
 - c) The use of drive-thru, pickup, or delivery options for food and drinks is highlyoo encouraged.oo
- III. Eviction Proceedings. That Bexar County rental property owners temporarily suspend evictions during the pendency of this Executive Order to prevent renters from being displaced due to the public health emergency, except on the order of the Bexar County Justice of the Peace Courts under the procedures and guidelines established by thoseod courts in circumstances which present an imminent threat of: (i) physical harm to the property owner, their employees, or other tenants, or (ii) criminal activity. Tenants may also pursue court remedies for an illegal lockout including seeking writs of re-entry, writs of retrieval and other emergency orders from the Justice of the Peace Courts. Tenants may obtain information on seeking emergency orders by visiting the self-help center located at: https://www.bexar.org/3168/Self-Help-Packets
- IV. <u>Foreclosure Proceedings</u>. That foreclosure proceedings within Bexar County be temporarily suspended during the pendency of this Executive Order to prevent the displacement of occupants during the public health emergency.
- V. <u>Outdoor Activity, Community-Use Parks and Property.</u> That consistent with executive order GA-18 issued by the Texas Governor, individuals may engage in

outdoor activity and sports at community parks and public and private recreational areas provided that the activities do not include contact with other participants and no more than four participants engage in the activity together ("Outdoor Activity"). In support of this measure, all public and private recreational areas where social distancing and sanitizing requirements are difficult or impossible to meet, including community and school playgrounds, outdoor exercise equipment, skate plazas, splash pads and basketball courts, including those which are located in apartment complexes or HOA areas, shall close for the duration of this Executive Order.

VI.nn Long-term Care Facilities. That in order to reduce the risk of transmission of COVIDnn 19 among vulnerable populations in long-term care facilities: i) no person shall visitnn nursing homes, state supported living centers, assisted living facilities, and long-termnn care facilities unless to provide critical assistance as determined through guidance from n the Texas Health and Human Services Commission; and ii) any individual providing inperson services, or who is otherwise employed or staffs a long-term care facility (e.g.nn nursing home, or assisted living facility), and has direct patient contact shall benn prohibited from working in, or visiting, more than (1) long-term care facility for anynn purpose as a result of the increased risk for transmission of COVID-19 to an at-risknn population. This prohibition is based on the Centers for Disease Control and Preventionnn (CDC) ridentifying that staff members working in multiple long-term care facilities cannn contribute to intra- and interfacility spread of COVID-19. The prohibition shall extendnn to any agency or organization who employs individuals for purposes of staffing or on ann temporary basis. Notwithstanding, this prohibition does not, and is not intended to,nn impact or restrict the ability of an individual, organization or entity to operate as annu essential business under the Order/Declaration of either the Texas Governor or thenn County Judge for Bexar County, but shall only restrict the ingress/egress and movementnn of persons into or out of more than one nursing home facility. Additionally, long-termin care facilities should follow all additional CDC guidance to take proactive steps tonn protect the health of residents and preserve the health care workforce by identifying andnn excluding potentially infected staff members, restricting visitation consistent with thenn Governor's Executive Order, the Mayor's Declaration and this Executive Order, nn ensuring early recognition of potentially infected patients, and implementing nn appropriate infection control measures.nn

VII.nn <u>Bexar County Justice Center Complex.</u> That the Bexar County Justice Centernn Complex shall have two points of access - one at the Paul Elizondo Tower at the Nuevann Street entrance and one at the Bexar County Courthouse Bexar Heritage Center entrancenn - and that all other county-owned or leased buildings shall have a single controlled pointnn of entrance. Further, all citizens and employees be shall be appropriately screenednn before entering any Bexar County owned or leased building. At the control points,nn citizens and employees shall be asked certain risk-related questions and theirnn

temperature taken by least obtrusive means. Any individual with a temperature exceeding 100 °F or who fails the screening process will be not be allowed to enter the building. Citizens are encouraged to call the department or office you are attempting to visit prior to visiting a county-owned or leased facility. All social distancing measures must be implemented at the above-described control points.

- VIII.ll <u>Bexar County Essential Business</u>. That residents of Bexar County conduct essentialll Bexar County business online or via regular mail to avoid visiting any Bexar Countyll facilities unless absolutely necessary.ll
- IX.ll <u>Price Gouging.</u> That during the pendency of this Executive Order, no person orll business entity ("Seller") shall engage in price gouging by selling any of the followingll goods or services for more than the regular retail price the Seller charged for the goodsll or services on March 19, 2020, except where an increased retail price is the result ofll documented cost increases from suppliers or other similar cost increases (including thell loss of supplier funds to support products):ll
 - 1)ll Groceries, beverages, toilet articles, ice;ll
 - 2)ll Restaurant, cafeteria, and boarding-house meals; orll
 - 3)ll Medicine, pharmaceutical, and medical equipment and supplies.ll
- X. <u>Bexar County Adult Detention Center.</u> That due to the risk of a COVID-19 outbreak in the Bexar County Adult Detention Center:
 - a.lll hereby direct that the Bexar County District Attorney's Office, the Publicll Defender's Office, the Office of Criminal Justice Policy, Planning & Programs, thell District and County Clerks and the judiciary continue to work diligently togetherll with the Bexar County Sheriff's Office to identify persons whose charged offensesll and backgrounds pose little to no risk to public safety and who may be eligible forll pretrial release.ll
 - b.l I further direct that those offices and instrumentalities take appropriate action toll provide for the immediate release of the individuals so identified in Section 11(a)ll above in accordance with any applicable law in order to mitigate the grave threatll posed by a concentrated outbreak of COVID-19 in the facility.ll
 - c.llUnder no circumstances shall this Executive Order be interpreted in a manner as toll require or direct the release on personal bond of any person previously convicted of ll a crime that involves physical violence or the threat of physical violence, or anyll person currently arrested for such a crime that is supported by probable cause inll violation of executive order GA 13.ll
- XI.ll <u>Personal Illness.</u> That any person who is ill should stay at home and not engage in anyll activity outside their residence unless related to treatment or health care. If someone inll a household has tested positive for COVID-19 then they must follow the isolation andll quarantine measures proscribed by local, state, or federal health authorities. If a memberll

of a household tests positive, then other members of the household should consider themselves positive if they become symptomatic and also follow the isolation and quarantine measures proscribed by local, state, or federal health authorities.

XII.ee Antibody Testing. A number of health care providers and others have been marketingee and administering COVID-19 antibody testing to consumers. If you are considering or planning an antibody test please make sure that the provider will administer an antibodyee test that has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration and that you will beee fully informed of the test protocol and test results. The City and County will workee together to protect the community from misleading or inaccurate testingee practices. Before you receive an antibody test please review FDA information andee guidance which can be found on https://www.fda.gov/medical-devices/letters-health-care-providers.ee

XIII.ee Enforcement. Excepting Section I, Subsection (i) of this Executive Order related toee face coverings, that any peace officer or other person with lawful authority is herebyee authorized to enforce the provisions of this Executive Order in accordance with theee authority granted under the Texas Disaster Act of 1975. Any person who violates thisee Executive Order may be subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or confinement for ace period not exceeding 180 days.ee

XIV.ee Severability. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Executiveee Order are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of thisee Executive Order should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any courtee or competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, ee clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections that can be given effect without the invalidee provision, and to this end, the provisions of this Executive Order are severable.ee

XV.ee Interpretation and Additional Terms. To the greatest extent possible, this Executive ee Order shall be interpreted as consistent with and supplemental to any executive orderee issued by the Texas Governor. All provisions of the executive orders of the Texasee Governor either existing or as, if and when issued, which are made applicable to allee jurisdictions by law shall be automatically incorporated into and constitute terms of thisee Executive Order, enforceable as if set forth herein without necessity for the issuance of ee any further orders.
