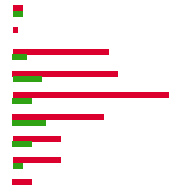
Cases by Gender  
Gender ● Male ● Female



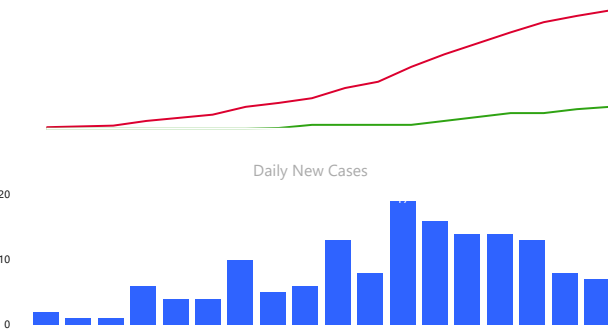

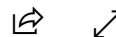
Cases By Area

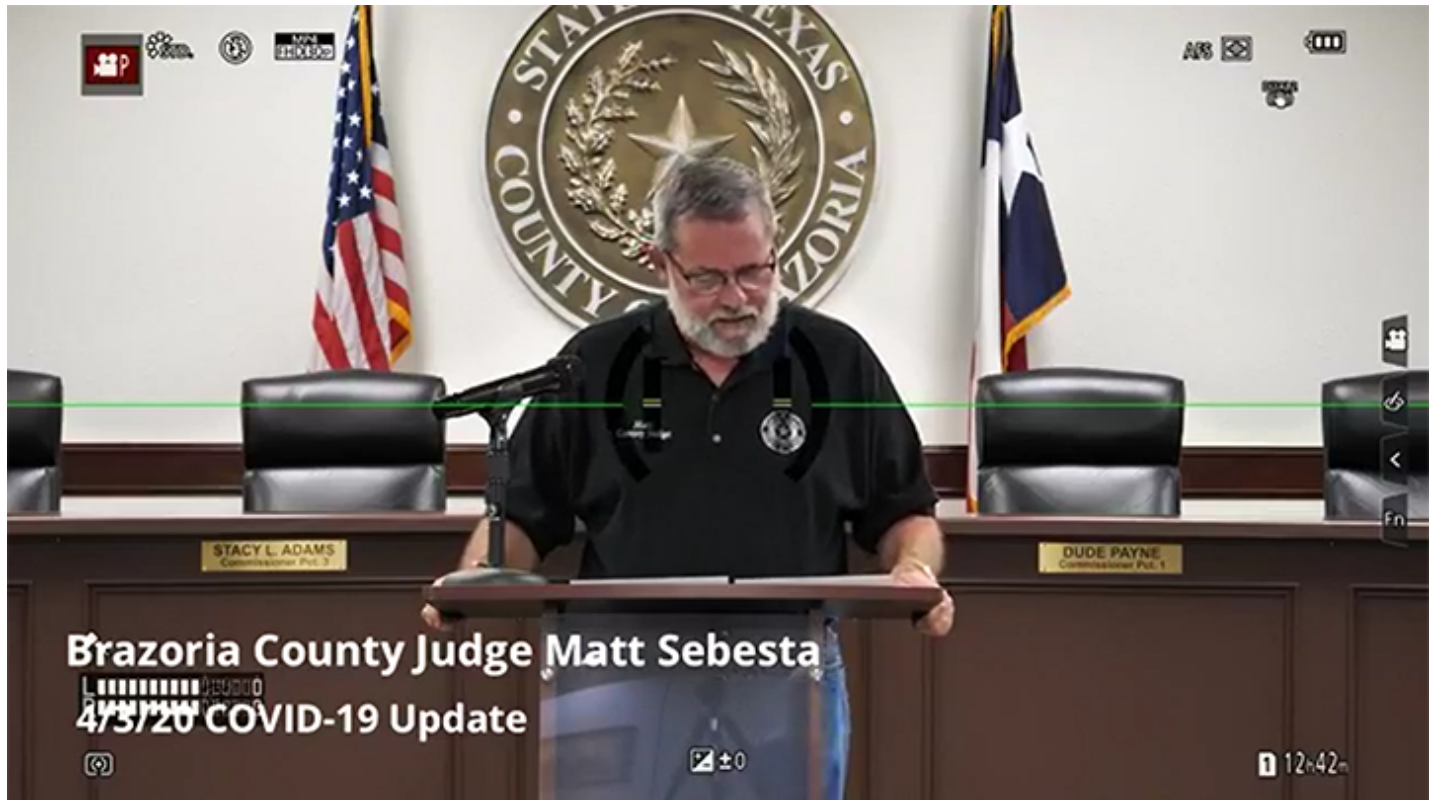

Help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases like COVID-19.

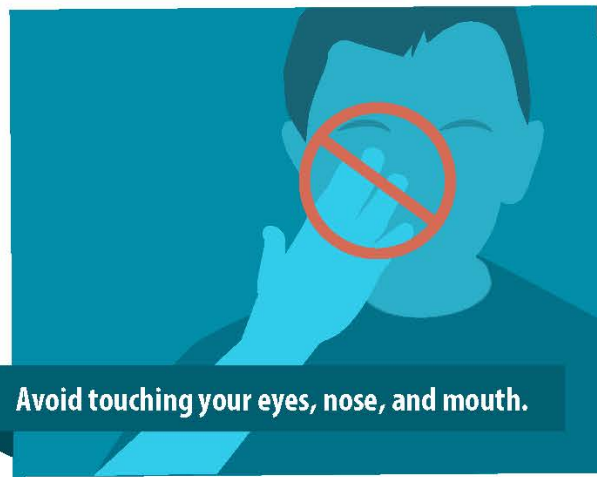
Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
